2021 was a 'watershed' year for Nebraska Rowing

Forward:

Meetings, newsletters and town-halls were followed by Constitutions, bylaws, leases and contracts. The initial FONR board saw the first glimmers of greatness in 2020. It is truly amazing what was accomplished while "pulling together" in 2021.

Leading with the 1st stroke:

We moved the team to Pawnee Lake giving it a practice facility closer to campus with calmer water and an opportunity for expansion. Coach Jensen was hired and funded, then navigated COVID protocols to get the team practicing again last spring. Coaching has exponentially increased water time for rowers, and also provided a layer of safety and security needed for the team to thrive. Four shells were repaired (some of which were cracked in half!). Equipment improvements will allow us to boat 62 athletes on the water simultaneously.

A 'Power Ten' for 50 years:

The '50th' crowdfunding effort exceeded its goal and raised \$38,000 to fulfil short-term needs and outfit the Pawnee Lake facility. Added to the other banquet

appeals and fundraisers, FONR netted \$70,000+ in pledges for planned giving. Rededicating the campus boathouse bought back memories and established a future vision for the hallowed space. The alumni rowing event reconnected former rowers with their beloved sport. The 50th Anniversary Banquet was a deserved celebration to honor 50 years of Crew at NU. It was an emphatic commemoration fueled with alumni reminiscing on the gifts of rowing.

Looking ahead to new challenges:

We are searching for 200 individual donations on February 16th to make our 3rd Glow Big Red Campaign a success. The "Coaching Endowment Challenge" will secure our future with a perpetual source of salary. Recruiting new board members and volunteers will define the success of 2022 and grow FONR using passionate, professional Alumni dedicated to improving Nebraska Crew.

Pawnee Lake Update:

Construction and remodeling continues on the Pawnee Lake 'Huddle' building. Electrical service has been established, water and sewer lines have been trenched and concrete walkways poured. New soffits have been was installed and most of the of the internal frame-work is complete. A sliding barn door to the storage area has been installed and we are working on an area to rinse off the shells. Students are excited to move in this spring and the crowdfunding dollars will help turn this space into an elite launching area for rowing practice.





Visible Improvement

The Campus Boathouse & Training Center continues to make progress.

Campus Recreation worked with UNL facilities to install new LED lighting. This brightened area will hopefully lead to more powerful workouts!

The new Floor was completed last fall and complements the FONR led cleaning last summer.

New Ergometers should arrive in January to complement and expand the capacity for a larger team to train at the same time.

Glow Big Red will help fundraise for AV equipment and a sound system.

As we approach the "Starting Line" for 2022, we look back at the goals accomplished in 2021 defined by our 'Pillars of Success." 

The UNL Campus Boathouse has been home to NU Crew and the vision of crew founder Allan Maybee. On Friday, September 24, 2021, over 130 crew alums, spouses and current crew members gathered to once again claim the boathouse as their domain - and begin a weekend of celebrating our 50+ year history, hosted by Friends of Nebraska Rowing. The boathouse, sporting a "new and improved" aesthetic, rocked with memories. laughter, renewed friendships, and the aroma of Valentino's pizza!

Emcee Pete Zandbergen guided the evening. Maybee shared early tales of NU Crew and "declaring" the boathouse as crew's habitat and presented Stan Campbell, recently named NU Campus Recreation Director Emeritus, a NU Crew Horseshoe plaque (upward facing horseshoe represents NU catching "good luck," while the interlocking downward horseshoe symbolizes dispersing "bad luck"). The plaque will proudly hang above the boathouse door. A duplicate will hang at the new Pawnee Lake facility. Scott Lewis, 75' generously donated a sweep oar signed by the 1974 IRA crew that finished 5th in the nation. Frank Dolezal received the "Keeper of the Cob" award for his contributions as a rower, coach, and FONR Board Member.

Current crew coach, Eric Jensen shared insights into today's program. FONR President Mark Stormberg reviewed some of the upgrades to the Training Center such as a new epoxy floor. Future upgrades will include interior lighting and electrical as well as new paint inside and out. The renovation of the rowing tank was highlighted as a future project. Mark reinforced FONR's commitment to growing the rowing program within the Campus Boathouse/Training Center for the next 50 years.

What a privilege it is to be part of the NU rowing family! We have the opportunity to ensure the NU Crew program remains strong and viable.

Sold Out Crowd Celebrates 50 Years Alumni raise over \$75K to support Nebraska Rowing

A banner that read "Welcome Home Crew," in large, red letters hung from the ceiling as 150 alums, family and friends entered the Champions Club. Old teammates enjoyed a wonderful evening reminiscing about great friends, great times and great stories.

Master of Ceremonies Pete Zandbergen started off the evening with a lively silent auction and social hour. Representatives from six decades raised toasts to their time on the crew. Matt Kush represented the 1970s, John Dundon, the 1980s, Brad Jones the 1990s, Diane Hastings Lewis, the 2000s, Hannah Tamayo Langdon, the 2010s and Eben Kohtz, the 2020s. Teammates raised their glasses in tribute to each other and to the future of Nebraska Rowing.

Crew founder Allan Maybee shared some wonderful stories about his failed attempts to solicit varsity-level support from legendary Husker Athletic Director Bob Devaney. Al spoke about the team's first trip to the Head of the Charles Regatta that saw hundreds of fans line the course to cheer for the Huskers with "Go Big Red" clickers.

Lisa Rohde, a farm girl from Hubbard, Nebraska reflected on her journey from a chance meeting at Abel/Sandoz that took her all the way to an Olympic Silver medal. She shared how the Nebraska Rowing program "changed my life."

Brad Kuhn, a 1980s oarsman, produced an outstanding video retrospective that told the improbable story of a rowing program founded in 1970 in the land-locked state of Nebraska. Campus Recreation Director Amy Lanham and Director Emeritus Stan Campbell noted a strong Alumni organization like Friends of Nebraska Rowing will be key to the success of club sports. They encouraged all Alums to keep "pulling together." The CREC staff received a huge ovation when they shared the investment of approximately \$100,000.00 in rowing team facilities on campus and at Pawnee Lake.

Coach Eric Jensen and 2021 Team President Katie Orr thanked alumni for their enthusiastic support of the program. It has enabled them to spend much more time on the water rowing. FONR President Mark Stormberg shared the alumni group's vision to "provide long-term consistent financial support and advice for a sustainable, competitive rowing program at the University of Nebraska." Funding priorities are to provide for current coaching salaries, build a Coaching Endowment for sustainability, and provide equipment to grow the program.

Amanda Kraus, CEO of US Rowing, joined the event via Zoom. She congratulated all for 50 great years. She encouraged the student athletes to persevere during these challenging times, telling them, "Nobody is tougher than rowers, you can push through." She also encouraged them to appreciate the special privilege they enjoy as collegiate rowers and the life lessons learned. "You are blessed to learn to row in college. There will be times in your life when you think that you can't keep going but you will, because you learned how to keep going in the boats."

"Sold. Sold. Sold," filled the air the rest of the evening, as auctioneer Jeff Merriman and his brother Joel, Class of '83, auctioned off some classic memorabilia such as a custom 50th Anniversary "Throw Big Red" cornhole game and commemorative sweep oars, all fashioned by Allan Maybee. Professional sculling lessons, a Colorado condo and even a quarter side of beef, brought in several thousand dollars for the program.

Coaching Endowment Challenge

Over the past year, the Nebraska Crew has been blessed in many ways. The reintroduced coaching structure has dramatically increased participation, athleticism and hours on the water. Continuity is key. With that in mind, FONR has set a goal of raising \$500,000 for a Coaching Endowment Fund (CEF). At an annual rate of 4.25%, the CEF would distribute \$21,250 annually to pay coaches and staff. This would double our current salary pool and provide a perpetual legacy from the Alumni to the student Athletes. Our long-term goal is to reach a principal amount that will fund the annual salaries of a full-time, professional coaching staff.

A \$50,000 commitment could be paid over ten years at the annual rate of \$5,000. Contributions would be made to the University of Nebraska Foundation and are tax deductible. Several Alumni including Lisa Rohde, Pete Zandbergen and Bill Brush have already stepped up to the \$50,000 challenge for a combined commitment of \$200,000. This support is conditional upon our ability to raise the remaining \$300,000 toward our initial goal. Commitments can be of any size and payable over 10 years, we just need a cumulative total of \$300,000.

Members of the active 70s & 80s crews are entering an age where they must take mandatory IRA distributions. The taxable income from an IRA distribution can be offset by a contribution to the CEF at the University of Nebraska Foundation. Larger contributions sooner will help the CEF balance grow faster.
